Shalmaneser of Assyria besieged Samaria 659 B.C.

The doctrine of the "lost" ten tribes being the Anglo-Saxons is a false teaching which has no Scriptural foundation. The word *Jew* and the word *Israel* are often used *synonymously*, especially after the scattering. The records of Ezra and Nehemiah clearly show it. Likewise, the New Testament – Acts 21:39, Rom. 11:1, 2 Cor. 11:22, Phil. 3:5, Rev. 7:2-3, Rev. 7:4-8.

This remnant dwelled there and even kept the Passover under King Josiah (2 Chron. 35:17-19). See also Ezra 7:8; 6:16, 17; 2 Chron. 11:5, 13-17; 15:8-9; Num. 23:9; Hos. 3:4; and Isa. 11:11, 16.

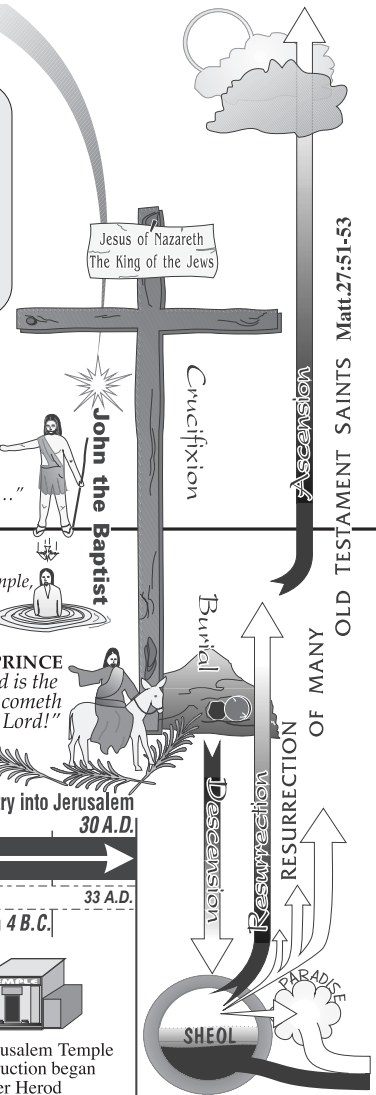
John the Baptist: The VOICE of one crying in the wilderness.

648 B.C. Sennacherib of Assyria besieged Jerusalem, but was overthrown by the Angel of the Lord (2 Kgs. 18-19).

The servitude of Judah began when Nebuchadnezzar, the King of Babylon, besieged Jerusalem in 524 B.C. After 18 years, the Temple was destroyed and burnt, and Jerusalem was carried away captive.

A.H. 3549* B.C. 454 The Medo-Persian period is obscured in many places in history. Ptolemy's Canon of the kings and their reigns, though accepted in general, is unreliable. The only reliable source of chronological datings is the Word of God. Cyrus' decree marked the start of Daniel's "Seventy Weeks".

Alexander the Great

A.H. 3836* B.C. 167 Antiochus IV, surnamed Epiphanes defiled the Temple (cf. Dan. 8:11-14). The Jew revolted and the struggle for independence began.

Pompey besieged Jerusalem and ended the Jewish struggle for independence.

Augustus Herod Tiberius

A.H. 4032* A.D. 30 Christ descended to sheol and preached to souls held captive in Satan's prison. He set free His captives (the righteous ones) into paradise (Eph. 4:8; 1 Pet. 3:18-20).

Head of Gold Lion with Eagle's Wings

Arms and Breast of Silver Bear with Three Ribs held between the teeth of its mouth

Belly and Thighs of Brass Leopard with Four Heads and Four Fowl's Wings

Legs of Iron Dreadful, Terrible, Strong and Diverse Beast with Iron Teeth and Ten Horns
